Mukurtu App

Introduction

The Mukurtu App (available on the App Store for free¹) is a useful tool for taking your Mukurtu site out into the community for demonstration and outreach, as well as for gathering additional metadata on people, place and languages.

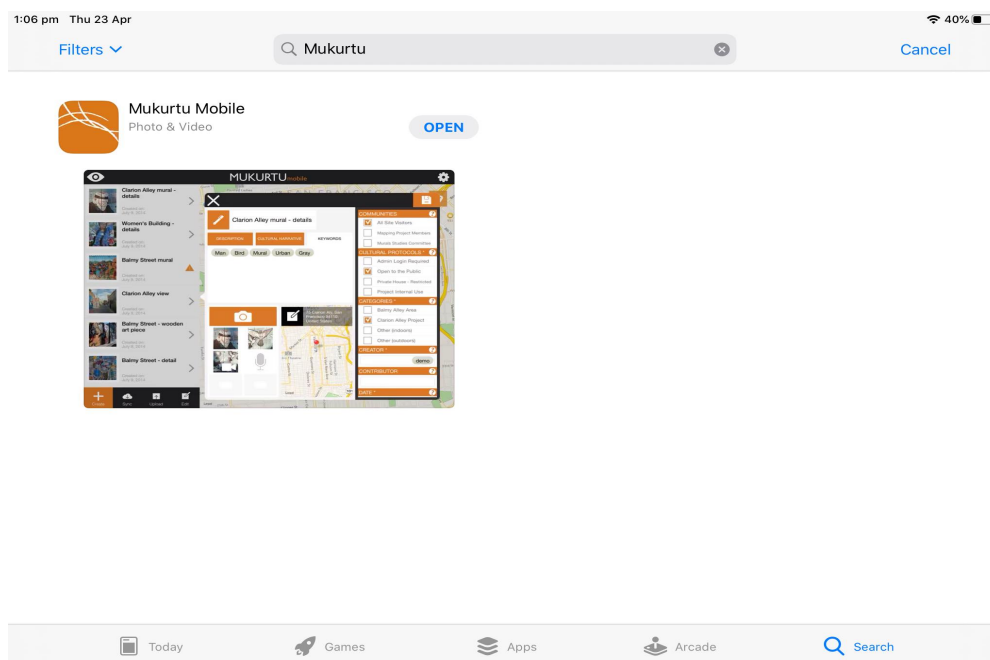
In addition, you can use the camera function of an iPad to record people's narrative about the media object itself or the content, and upload the narrative into the Mukurtu media library. The recording can then be dropped onto the Cultural Narrative and Traditional Knowledge fields on the Mukurtu Core tab to further enrich the metadata.

The app is in development form, and although working quite well, it should not be used a substitute for entering records via computer.

Using the Mukurtu App

1. Download the app

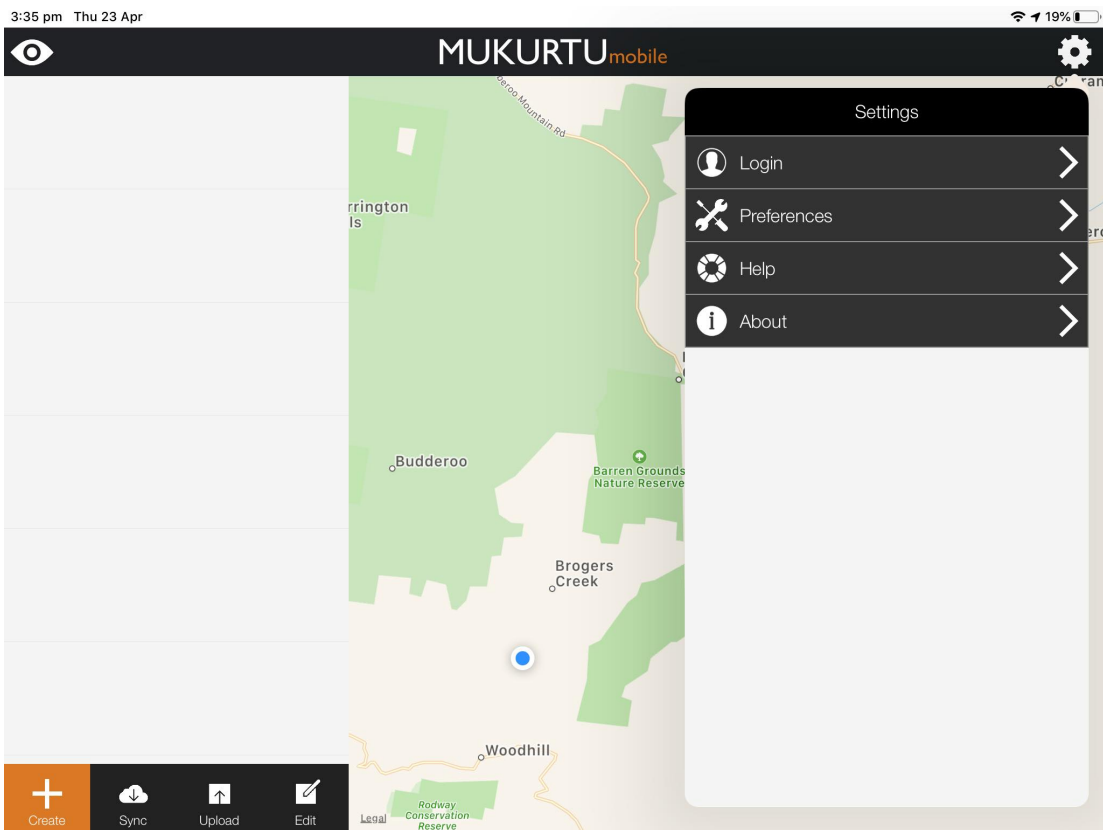
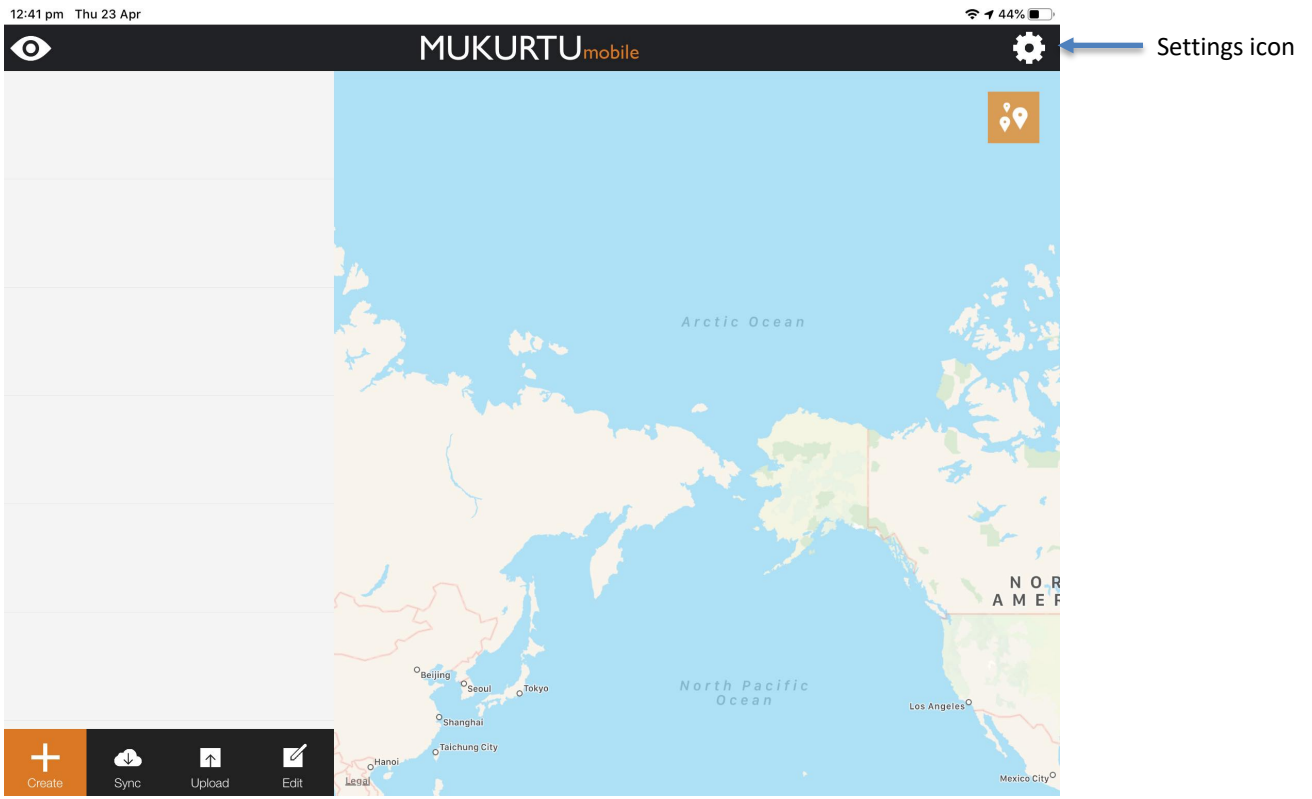
Search for Mukurtu to find the Mukurtu Mobile app. Download it.

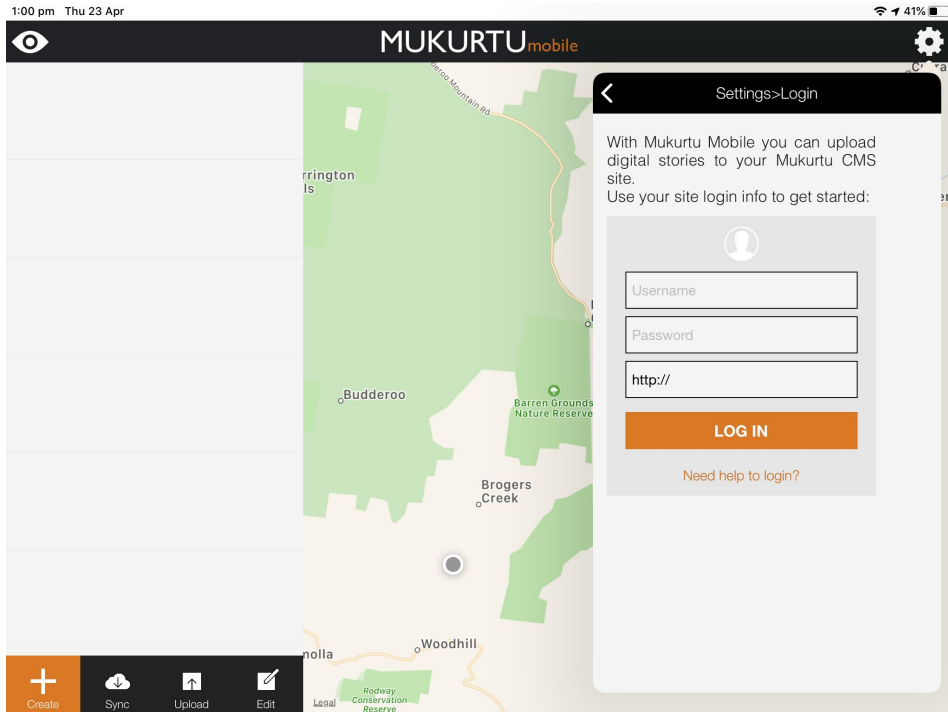
2. Open the app and click the Settings icon in the top right hand corner

The app will open with a map default screen. Click the Settings icon to open the menu.



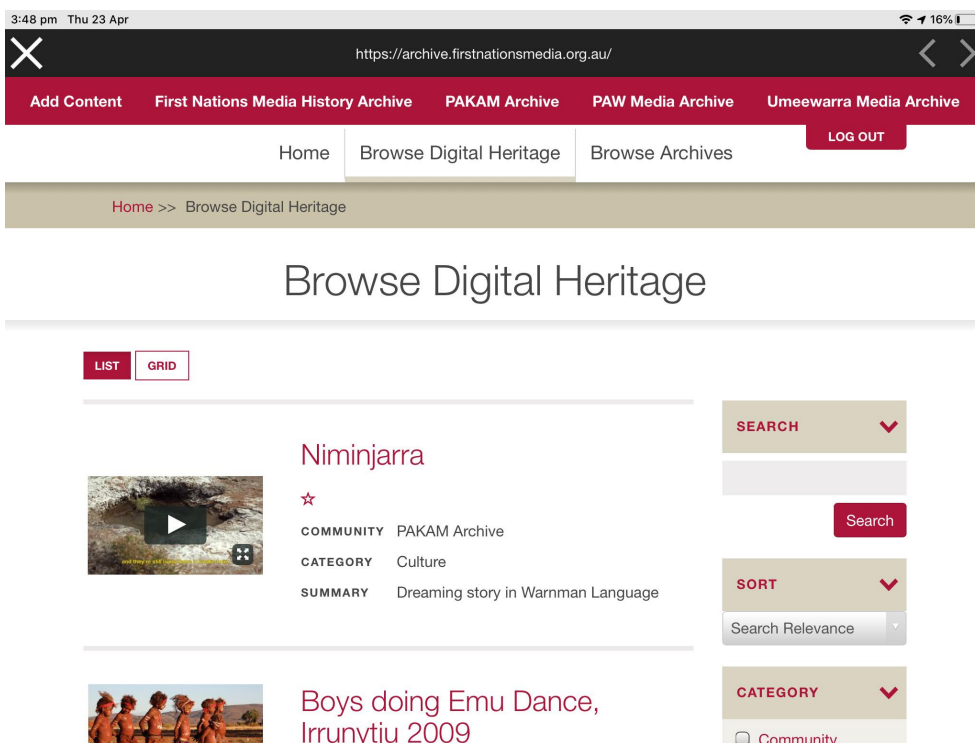
3. Login

- Remove the http:// and enter the URL for the Archive in the third field – <https://archive.firstnationsmedia.org.au>.
- Enter the appropriate login and password for your Archive and role.
- Click Login.



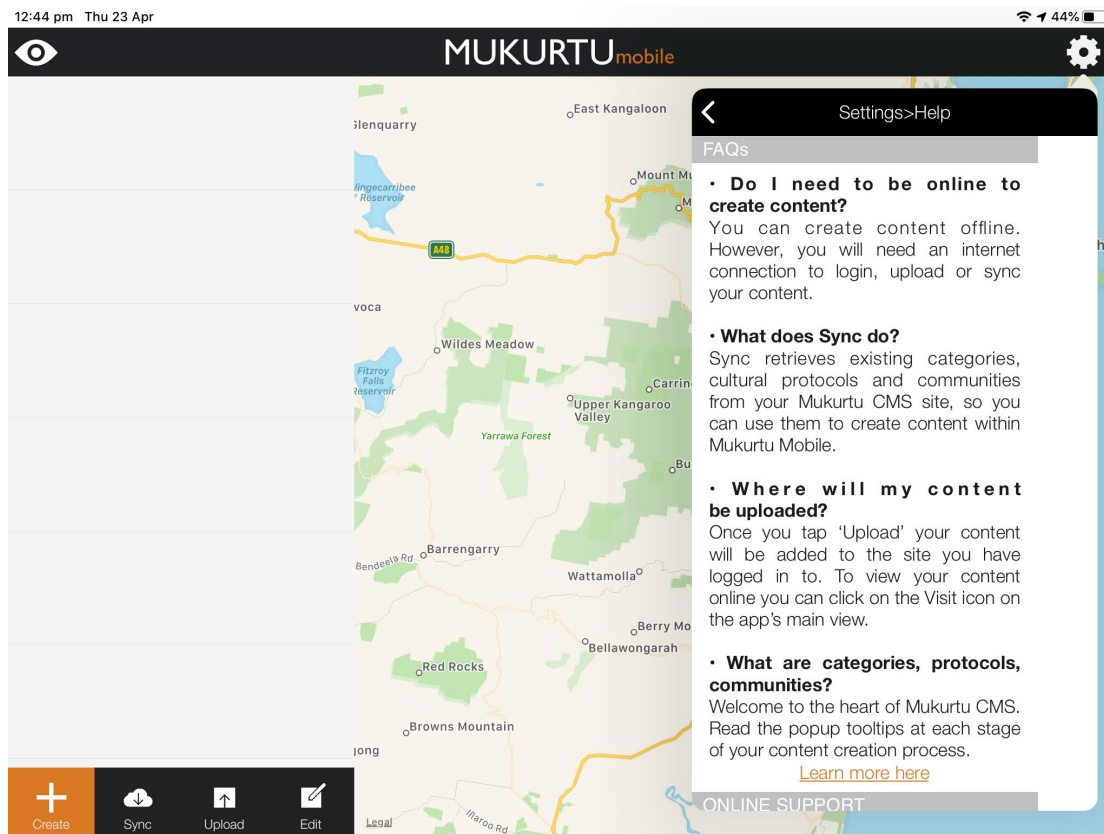
4. Open the Archive

- Click on the eye in the top left hand corner.
- The Mukurtu site will open as an overlay over the map screen.



5. Settings

- To access the settings again, click the X in the top left hand corner. The archive screen will close.
- Click the Settings icon again will open a range of menu options and further information, including FAQs.



6. Reopening the Archive

- Click the eye icon in the top left corner to reopen the Archive.
